The Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Vestal, County of Broome and the State of New York was held at the Town Hall, 605 Vestal Parkway West, Vestal, NY on August 13, 2014.

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### **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

Deputy Supervisor Majewski presented Proof of Posting and *Affidavit of Publication* for the **Public Hearing** regarding an application for a **Vehicle Service Station Permit**, under Section 24-385 of the Town of Vestal Code, by Dino Martone, **Wreckz 2 Rodz** for the location at 305 Vestal Parkway East, BCTMP# 157.18-1-18.1, for an automotive detailing business. The 239 l & m was received from Broome County Planning & Economic Development and the NYS DOT with no significant comments concerning this application. The *Affidavit of Proof of Mailing* was submitted by the applicant. He then opened the Public Hearing.

Dino Martone, the permit applicant, explained that this will be an automotive detailing business. No vehicle service work such as oil changes will be done and they will only use biodegradable products.

The Town Attorney asked Mr. Martone if the applicant has thoroughly reviewed Section 24.385 of the Vehicle Service Station code and if they are in full compliance or will be in full compliance of each and every provision of that particular section and that there is nothing that needs Board attention other than what has been set forth in the statute. Mr. Martone replied he had not reviewed the entire section of the code, but will certainly read it in depth and will adhere to it. He has already complied with the requirements set forth by the Code Department. If this is so, Town Attorney Berger stated the Board finds that the public convenience and welfare will be substantially served by the issuance of this permit.

Hearing or seeing no one else wishing to speak, Deputy Supervisor Majewski closed this public hearing.

The Board has reviewed the submitted Short Environmental Assessment Form under SEQRA as submitted by the applicant and finds it acceptable.

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### Public Hearing for Proposed Local Law “E” of the Year 2014

Deputy Supervisor Majewski presented *Proof of Posting* and *Affidavit of Publication* for the Public Hearing regarding proposed **Local Law “E”** of the Year 2014 - Entitled *Contracts Awarded to Best Value Bidders, Amending Chapter 2 Article I by including new sections 2-5 through 2-8*. He then opened the Public Hearing.

A speaker feels that this law will open up the opportunity to abuse the system. He does not feel that this Local Law protects the taxpayer.

Another speaker noted that lowest bidder is not always the best bidder. Sometimes you get what you pay for.

Hearing or seeing no one else wishing to speak, Deputy Supervisor Majewski closed this public hearing.

### Adopt Local Law “E” of the Year 2014

Resolved to adopt proposed **Local Law “E”** of the Year 2014 - Entitled *Contracts Awarded to Best Value Bidders, Amending Chapter 2 Article I by including new sections 2-5 through 2-8* as follows:

### Section 2-5 General Provisions

#### **Section 2-5.1 Purpose**

This local law provides for the Vestal Town Board to exercise their local option from § 103, Subdivision 1 of the New York Municipal Law, as amended by Chapter 608 of the Laws of 2011 and Chapter 2 of the Laws of 2012. This amendment authorizes Towns to award purchase and service contracts subject to competitive bidding under General Municipal Law § 103 based on either lowest responsible bidder or “best value,” as defined in § 163 of the New York State Finance Law. This “best value” option may be, but is not required to be, used to award an applicable purchase contract to optimize quality, cost, and efficiency among responsive and responsible offers instead of the lowest responsible bidder.

#### **Section 2-5.2 Basis for award**

In accordance with § 103, Subdivision 1 of the New York General Municipal Law, as amended by Chapter 608 of the Laws of 2011 and Chapter 2 of the Laws of 2012, Town

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Boards may award contracts, including both purchase contracts and those contracts for service work, that have been procured pursuant to competitive bidding under General Municipal Law § 103 by either lowest responsible bidder or “best value”.

Goods and services procured and awarded on the basis of best value are those that the Town Board determines will be of the highest quality while being the most cost efficient. The determination of quality and cost efficiency shall be based on objectively quantified and clearly described and documented criteria, which may include, but shall not be limited to, any or all of the following: cost of maintenance; proximity to the end user if distance or response time is a significant term; durability; availability of replacement parts or maintenance contractors; and longer product life; product performance criteria; and quality of craftsmanship.

#### **Section 2-5.3 Applicable Contracts**

These sections apply only to purchase contracts involving an expenditure of more than \$20,000 including contracts for service work (i.e. building services under Article 9 of the Labor Law and utility services), but excluding any purchase contract necessary for the completion of a public works contract pursuant to Article 8 of the State Labor Law as well as excluding any other contracts in accordance with future state law. If the dollar thresholds of General Municipal Law § 103 are increased or decreased in the future by the State Legislature, the dollar thresholds set forth herein shall be deemed simultaneously amended to match the new General Municipal Law thresholds.

#### **Section 2-5.4 Documentation**

A quote or proposal received pursuant to standard bidding procedures may be awarded on either a best value or lowest responsible bidder standard. All information gathered in the course of the bidding procedures of this section shall be filed with the documentation supporting the subsequent purchase or public works contract. When a contract is awarded on the basis of best value rather than a lowest responsible bidder, the basis for determining best value shall be thoroughly and accurately documented.

#### **Section 2-5.5 Procurement Policy**

Any inconsistent provision of the Town's procurement policy, as adopted prior to the effective date of this chapter by resolution of the Town Board, or as amended thereafter, shall be deemed superseded by the provisions of this chapter.

#### **Section 2-6**

If any part or provision of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such

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judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Local Law or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances, and the Town Board of the Town of Vestal hereby declares that it would have passed this Local Law or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

### **Section 2-7**

All ordinances, local laws and parts thereof inconsistent with this Local Law are hereby repealed.

### **Section 2-8**

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

### **PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR (Agenda Items Only)**

A speaker expressed concern about the Timber Harvesting Permit application. He lives in this area and is concerned about the water drainage problems. This area was previously harvested and that is what caused the current drainage issues. The drainage issues should be fixed before any more timber harvesting is done.

Deputy Supervisor Majewski noted this is a selective cutting. Berms will be created that will run east to west, not north to south, to eliminate water coming down the hill. The water runoff will be diverted. There are only 4 trees being taken in the first fifty feet of the buffer zone.

### **ADDITIONAL PUBLIC COMMENTS**

A speaker would like to know if the residents can use the land that was bought out by FEMA in the Twin Orchards area. A home owner in that neighborhood would like to mow the land and plant apple trees. The Town Attorney explained all the buyout properties are deed restricted. If he has a plan, the Board will have to look at his intended uses and determined if they are permissible.

A speaker reiterated his objection to the Board's approval of settlements that reduce property taxes. Our assessment roll shows that we are over assessed and a reval should be done. He still believes that he is over assessed and that the Assessor favors certain property owners.

A speaker referenced a gas well that was drilled by Mega Energy on Echo Road in 2009. He wonders what type of notification, if any, was given to the Town prior to commencing the drilling operation.
